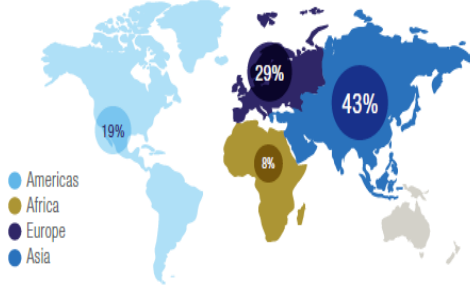

Over 13.8% of the population of Quebec is English-speaking.

Our program partners secondary students with community, health and social services organizations.

We want to give students first hand experience working in these fields.

Our goal?

Increase access to jobs in health and social services to qualified students after they graduate.

Why?

Retaining qualified, English-speaking professionals will vastly improve the health and social services care systems across the province.

We want to train the next generation of care providers for English-speakers in Quebec.

OUR APPROACH

We work with schools, students, and health and social services organizations.

We provide enriching opportunities for student engagement and tangible help for organizations that host volunteers.

It is important to us that students come away understanding how and why they contributed their time to an organization, and that they have a chance to reflect on what skills and capacities they developed as a result.

It is important to us that our work betters the community that we are a part of, and that we improve access for the most vulnerable members of society in achieving this work.



The Placement Process

Step 1:

We partner with health & social services (H&SS) organizations to see where gaps in services are.

Step 2:

We partner with high schools to support work done by placement coordinators to serve the organizations we have identified.

Step 3:

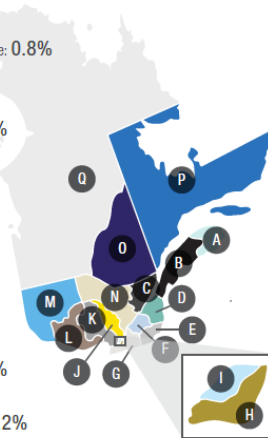
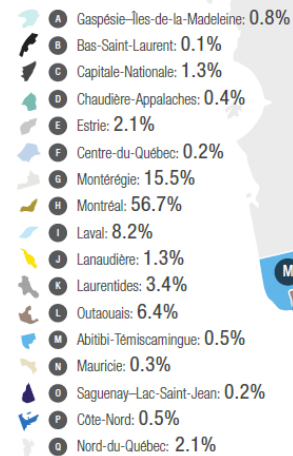
We track student placements, offering check-ins and opportunities for students to meet one another, facilitating critical reflections and pre-service orientations.

Post-placement:

- We want to see students explore careers in H&SS fields.
- Due to feeling more rooted in the sector, they will be more inclined to stay in province.
- Placement feedback offers students insight into their career objectives and desires
